

**ORDINATION:** After theology, those Jesuits who are called to the priesthood are ordained

SPECIAL STUDIES: As part of his ongoing formation, a Jesuit may pursue advanced studies in a particular academic or professional field. TERTIANSHIP: A Jesuit completes his formation of prayer, guidance, and studies with tertianship, a period of preparation







The first Jesuit secondary school was established in Messina, Sicily, in 1548.

Saint Ignatius went on to approve the establishment of nearly 40 schools during the last 10 years of his life—including the Roman College (today's Pontifical Gregorian University).

The Society offered free education at a time when only the very wealthy could afford it.

When the first Cristo Rey Jesuit High School opened in Chicago in 1996,
Catholic educators across the country and prominent philanthropists committed to educational reform took notice. From these seeds emerged the Cristo Rey Network, which today comprises 37 schools nationwide (two of which opened in 2019), with three more set to open in 2020 and 2021.

Many Jesuits count the opportunity to serve in one of these innovative schools as a meaningful part of their formation.


